- Critical Incident Response Team presentation
- K9 presentation
- Traffic Services and Safety presentation
- Crime Scene Management
- Community Patrol presentation
- Graduation ceremony and barbeque

Applicants Must:

- Be 12 or 13 years of age by July 5, 2016
- Must reside in Chatham-Kent
- Must have an interest in policing

Things You Need to Know:

- **There is no cost!** (children are required to bring lunch)
- Transportation to and from the camp is the responsibility of the parent/guardian
- The Chatham-Kent Police Service reserves the right to select candidates


